About the Colloquium

At the beginning of May five authors from England and USA came to Berlin at the invitation of Literarisches Colloquium Berlin to live at their Wannsee House. The leader of the group was James Saunders, author of "Next time I'll Sing to you" and whose new play "A Scent of Flowers" opened in London at the end of the month. Together the writers wrote, discussed, argued, drank, wrote, played cards, rewrote; they wrote new things, revised old ones, disagreed with one another ... The pieces to be seen tonight represent a small part of the result. The choice was regulated by shortness, simplicity, entertainment value, and also — and this was the foremost consideration — by the benefit the authors themselves considered they would derive by seeing their pieces rehearsed and performed.

About the Authors:

Piers Paul Read: Born 1941, lives in Yorkshire, educated at Cambridge.

He has been two years in Berlin, where he wrote his first novel. Tonight's play is one of a series of experimental pieces.

Derek Marlowe: Born in London, 1938, writes mainly for the theatre. His first play, produced at the Royal Court Theatre, London, won the Foyle Award for the best new play of 1961.

Peter Bergman: 1924, born Cleveland, Ohio; graduate of Yale University; has had a number of musicals produced. He is presently working on a movie script.

Tom Stoppard:

Born 1937. Lives in London. A radio and television writer, with a play in the current season at the Thalia Theater, Hamburg. He is working on a full-length play of which tonight's is a part.

Tom Cullinan: Lives in Cleveland, Ohio, works in educational Television. A Ford Foundation Playwright in 1961, he has had several plays produced at American regional theatres. He has just completed his first novel.
