

Increasingly more Youth Theatre members are participating in backstage roles within the theatre as part of the Questors' continuing drive to provide opportunities to get involved and become part of the live theatre experience. This is their club too and they are the future of the Questors.

Still, there is plenty more coming up in the near future, special theatre skills Easter courses, the annual 'Summer Look-in' (involving all 500 members over four days of performances) and our Summer holidays project to name but a few. Directors notes

The action takes place in Ankh-Morpork, an ancient Discworld city. The Patrician has worked hard over the years to achieve a balance in Ankh-Morpork.

The patrician said..."It was two hundred dollars per capita; if per capita was a problem, decapita could be arranged."

Not a balance between good and evil, but between the numerous sides of evil. He maintains the balance by allowing the various sides to form self governing guilds.

In return for an agreed level of crime per annum the thieves themselves saw to it that unauthorized crime was met with the full force of Injustice, which was generally a stick with nails in it.

Not everyone is happy with this balance.

Dragons disappeared a long time ago. They did not become extinct...

Lady Ramkin... "No... I think they just found somewhere where they could really BE... Where they could really fulfil their potential... Where the gravity is not so strong perhaps."

Using a spell from an ancient book of magic, coupled with the force of a number of peevish minds channelling their energy, a 60ft fire breathing dragon is summoned to Ankh Morpork. The dragon proceeds to cause mayhem and panic in the city by flaming people and torching buildings.

It's a metaphor of human bloody existence, a dragon. And if that wasn't bad enough, it's also a bloody great hot flying thing.

The drunken, apathetic City Watch witness these events and do their utmost to avoid unraveiling the mess.

Sgt Colon... "Right, you bastards, you're... you're geography"

"Corporal Nobbs, why are you kicking people when they're down?" "Safest way, sir."

The honest, righteous, naïve new volunteer city watchman, Carrot (a 6" 6" dwarf) unwittingly assists them in their quest.

All dwarfs have beards and wear up to twelve layers of clothing. Gender is more or less optional.

Lady Ramkin and her pet swamp dragon Goodboy Bindle Featherstone of Quirm come to their assistance.

Lady Ramkin's bosom rose and fell like an empire.

The librarian (an orang-utan who communicates by charades) acts as a behind the scenes sleuth.

Can they rid the city of the dragon? Will they solve the mystery of who summoned the dragon?

Will life in Ankh Morpork ever be the same again?

"It's not that I don't want to die...it's just that life is a habit that's hard to break."

Carol Hunter - Assistant Stage Manager

Milan Fernando - Properties

Milan joined the Questors in 2003 on a full stomach after the Open Day BBQ. His back stage credits include *The Witches* and *Oliver!* Outside Questors, he is a keen musician, a playworker, and charity worker.

Karl Phillips - Lighting Operator

Karl has been involved with technical theatre for 5 years, he has worked as an ASM on two dance shows with the Young Set Theatre Group, and has recently lit his first show over Christmas 2005, King Arthur. This is his first show at The Questors he is currently studying Theatre Production at Kingston College.

Alun Jones - Sound Operator

Alun has worked on 13 shows. He was sound designer on Oliver! and Little Shop of Horrors since which he has dreamed of returning to the simple life and lack of responsibility of operating, only to find that Guards! Guards! has more sound cues than all his previous shows put together.

Kate Chandler - Make-Up and Hair

Kate has previously worked on R.U.R at The Questors. She has also worked on various fashion shows, London Fashion Week, Harpers Bazaar magazine, as well as assorted short films.
