

Dogs Barking

When I first read Dogs Barking I was captured by the sharpness of the writing and how compelling the story was, a story that I'm sure most of us are familiar with in some form: the end of an affair. Richard Zajdlic has observed with unnerving accuracy the bittersweet moments within the relationship and the devastating pain of its ending.

The story revolves around Alex and Neil and the flat they purchased in better times. After Neil's infidelity with his boss he leaves the property and Alex. The play begins with Neil returning to 'talk' with Alex. We are shown the good and the bad aspects of their relationship, and the emotional turmoil as they battle over possession of their former home.

The writing and the observational skills are so shrewd that I'm sure everyone will be able to identify with some aspect or character within the play, whether good or bad. This, I think, is the play's strength, it pulls no nunches and lets the audience, see human nature in the raw.

The past couple of months working on the show have been incredibly enjoyable. Casting, production meetings, rehearsals and marketing, all have been interesting. huggly productive and fun. 


