In the wrong hands, it adds another dimension to bullying. It is harder to deal with because there is no physical contact between the bully and the victim.

Adult members of the theatre have been very supportive, but this is very much our own production. We are all 17, and this is the first time that young members at Questors have ever been able to produce, direct and star in their own production.

The director of The Questors Youth Theatre, Alex Marker: "When Ellen and Remi outlined their desire to stage Chatroom! I was adamant that the production should have as little adult interference as possible. They have been involved in every aspect. This is a first for us, and for them an insight into the whole process of what it is to stage a production."
