This question lies at the heart of *The Pierglass*, a mirror in which the characters see themselves, their lives and the truth. Through art we discover more about ourselves.

Charlotte, the young pit at the heart of our story, is forbiciden from living her own life so lives it instead through books and the plays of Shakespeare. Fortuitously, a group of travelling players arrive in her town and provide an opportunity for her to escape the prison in which the Stepmother and doceitful Lawyer keep her. Ralph, the young actor faced with the prospect of playing Romeo without ever having experienced love himself, is desperately seeking his Juliet. Around them, the theatricals cause ripples amongst this sleepy community, Charlotte's madis try to help her and the locals have secrets of their own to reveal which will have a significant effect! Parallels between the Shakespeare plays and real events in the lives of the character's highlight truths hidden beneat the surface.

Having been involved in the original production of this wonderful show when it was premiered at the Ediflountly Festival in 1994 (winning a Fringe First Award), I was delighted to have the opportunity to direct it and bring the magic to life again. Tim Notro has fully supported our production (even providing the set from the original show) and the fantastic music composed by Ned Benneth beauffully enhances the overall production.

Being written especially for young actors to play to their skills but also encourage them to challenge themselves, this above was an ideal choice for our large and talented youth theatre. The Guestors is so unique, having the opportunity to involve and train young people in performance skills who can then go on to become adult Cuestors members. James Deverell – Assistant Director and Fight Choreographer

2009. This is the first time he has been involved in a Questors production.
James trained as an actor at East 15 School of Acting, has since acted in a
